At Stellar VBS, kids explore how Jesus shines hope, love, forgiveness, and joy to the world—and how we can do the same with his power!


You can expect 5 days full of faith discoveries, memorable music, and epic adventures that help kids grow in friendship with Jesus.

Make sure your kids and their friends are registered and ready to go! If you have any questions, please see me, your Stellar VBS director Jennifer Griffith



Keep Trying

In *The God Who Stays*, contemporary Christian musician Matthew West writes about the pandemic's fear-filled early days. After his concert tour was abruptly canceled in March 2020, he rode to an airport "feeling utterly hopeless about a world that was spinning out of control." Then Arthur, his ride-share driver, began singing along to the radio — and the song happened to be West's "The God Who Stays." West joined in, jokingly asking how he sounded. "Not so good," Arthur replied, not knowing West's identity. "You keep trying."

The driver shared how those lyrics uplifted him during life's difficulties, and West later recalled that conversation during lockdown, while wondering where God was. The musician realized he had "settled for a socially distant relationship with the One who is nearer than I dare to believe, closer than the air I breathe." But West pictured "God running toward me with open arms like the prodigal's father," and he resolved to keep trying — and to grow closer to the God who always stays.


