

Music has been a big part of my life since high school. I am sure a lot of us might share that experience. We had the awakening with "that song" that led us to embrace a certain genre. I remember the first rock song that I fell in love with. It was U2's Mysterious Ways. I can tell you where I was when I first heard it.

After college, I started taking guitar lessons. I have had an off and on relationship with guitar playing ever since! While I am not that great at guitar, it does help me connect with emotion and learn songs that I enjoy, which helps me enjoy them more.

Where music has changed for me in the past 10-12 years is that I have been more intentional about attending live shows and listening widely. I own about 800 vinyl records that spans about seventy years and many, many genres. For a while, I had a subscription to a service called Vinyl Me Please, which sends a record once a month. You have no idea what you're getting. What I discovered is that there is more good music out there than I previously thought or imagined.

Music touches a range of emotions. There are songs for happy and sad times, love

and hate, mystery and discovery – the entirety of the human existence. It's impressive how we humans turn life into poetry.

Psalms push us to God's love and faithfulness no matter what is happening in our lives.

In the Psalms, we find songs like that. There is worship and praise, sadness and lament, questioning, confession, and so much more. One of the reasons why I love teaching through the Psalms is that, no matter what, we find touchpoints with our own story as it connects to our feelings, beliefs, and understanding of God. And, at the same time, the Psalms push us to God's love and faithfulness no matter what is happening in our lives.

I hope this series, which takes us to September, pushes all of us to read the Psalms more. If you want some good resources about the Psalms, I love NT Wright's *The Case for the Psalms* or Tim and Kathy Keller's *The Songs of* Jesus: Daily Devotions in the Psalms. If you'd like any resources, just ask me!

New Cookbooks Will Be Here Soon! by Phyllis McCullough




